El Cocido - The Spanish Stew

One of Spain's traditional dishes often finds its way onto the Menú de Día of those little cafeterias right across the country; it is the simple Cocido or stew. It is wholly sustaining as a meal in its own right as a starter or main course and I have to say, whilst I often go for it myself, as does my friend Val, her husband Maurice is possibly more atypical extranjero and perhaps a little less adventurous and would say 'what's in it?' And, of course, you can never predict that, in the certain knowledge that the Spanish use almost everything and would never throw out a bone that could add flavour to a stew; that's what makes it a perfect choice to me and Val.

At El Prado Restaurante, here in San Miguel de Salinas, in June we had Fabada, a cocido by any other name, and it simply had white beans with a mixture of roughly chopped ham or jamón plus chorizo, a couple of cloves of garlic and cubed potatoes. At Rincon de Miguel in Los Montesinos 'Cocido de mi abuela' Miguel's Grandmother's daily offering, is always on the menu and follows the same type of ingredients plus whatever else comes to hand. Both were massive on flavours and fabulous with fresh bread and the beginning of the wine.

Try my easy recipe... it takes about five minutes to make, half an hour to cook, and would be as good on the menu of any of the best restaurants - the perfect starter that needs no attention whilst you entertain your guests with Cava. Take about 100gms of jamón, chorizo or some of those little salamis – roughly chop and fry off in the saucepan to release some of the fat. Add three peeled whole gloves of garlic or a whole onion if preferred. Then add all the contents of a 400gms jar of either Alubia Blanca – white beans or lentejas – lentils or garbanzos – chick peas (only one mind) and a medium sized potato cubed large dice-size, half a small carton of tomato fritto, pepper but no salt, as often the jamón provides enough. Cook slowly for half an hour or so and if required add a little stock or water to adjust the consistency, leave to stand and serve with fresh bread. Delicious.

10 THINGS YOU MAY NOT KNOW ABOUT SAN MIGUEL DE SALINAS

By Pedro the Fisherman

1. It was always described as a breezy place. In 1848, Pascual Madoz, in his Geographical Dictionary of Spain, said it was 'on a hillside to the west of the salt lakes of Torrevieja and struck by many strong winds'. It once had four windmills. Now only the ruins of one remain.
2. Hannibal, the famous Carthaginian general and his army, with elephants, is thought to have come past here in 218BC on his way from Cartagena to Italy to fight the Romans.
3. There was once a Roman settlement called Nisdomia here. It was abandoned by the 4th Century AD after which there were just a few scattered dwellings and fincas. The first houses of the village were probably constructed from 1599.
4. The first church at San Miguel was built in 1600, but had to be demolished in 1689 due to the poor way it had been built. The present church dates from 1723. It was set on fire in the Civil War, but restored afterwards.
5. The church is believed to be haunted by the ghost of Tio Santico (Holy Uncle), a local resident well known for his sanctity. Some say he can be seen at night wandering the church, clutching rosary beads in his long fingernails.
6. The cave houses were once used by people coming to harvest the esparto grass that grew in abundance around here. Esparto grass was used to manufacture mats and straw hats.
7. There was in the 19th century a thriving 'yeso' or gypsum (plaster) industry in the area. The new 'Castillo de Conesa' was once a gypsum factory and quarry.
8. The great Torrevieja earthquake in 1829 destroyed many houses in the town, but the church was the only one in the Vega Baja that survived relatively unscathed.
9. During the Civil War 1936-39, there was little trouble in the town thanks to the republican mayor Jose Barcelona who kept 'left' and 'right' on good terms with each other. In fact, the two sides often protected and fed each other during and after the war.
10. The new town hall being built in calle 19 Abril is the third town hall in the village's history. The one next door was built in the 1988. The previous one was the building opposite Bargain Books, now the Tourism Office, which was built on the ancient cemetery in 1840 and included a jail.

SUMMER DAZZLE

Lagunaria patersonia by Capability Miguel

After 7 years of living in San Miguel de Salinas I am rewarded everyday by the investment I made with my garden planting scheme. There is not a week in the year that passes when one of my neighbours doesn't ask me what the name of a particular plant is, one that is spectacularly in bloom at that moment. No, I purposely didn't plant palms and citrus, because they are a nightmare and somewhat boring. The appeal of slicing one of my own lemons for a gin and tonic by the pool is not enough - I want year-round sudden splashes of spectacular colour.



In June and July look out for *Lagunaria patersonia*, a large evergreen shrub closely allied to Hibiscus, covered head to foot with a profusion of pale pink, almost purple flowers. It's another native of eastern Australia, like many of the flowering plants that do well on the Costa Blanca, and once established requires little water. It forms quite a compact pyramid-shape but can grow into a sizeable specimen of 15-30ft (4.5-9m) if not pruned back in the autumn. The only downside is that the seed pods contain its bright orange seeds amongst irritant bristles, giving it a common name of the Cow Itch Tree so prune with gloves.

Lagunaria patersonia is a very spectacular and showy shrub that attracts the bees and is great for a sunny spot. The only local Jardineria that could identify it and supply it was Montezahar at Los Montesinos.
